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## Most important issues from Estonian producer's perspective

- 1. Unequal position for the producers located in EU:
  - 1. Border with Non-EU countries (~3000 MW) acts as generation. But Import is not subject of submission of availability plans and UMM-s to Nord-Pool.
  - Baltic TSO-s allocate interconnection capacity in non-EU border for free to Inter-RAO.
     (Intra-EU border is allocated based on market terms)

**Conclusion:** Import from non-EU countries is cheaper and easier compared to production and trade inside EU.

Regulators should intervene and define corrections



## Most important issues from Estonian producer's perspective (2)

- 2. No power plant will be built without subsidies:
  - Competition between subsidies, not between companies

Conclusion: Coordination between countries is needed.





## Most important issues from Estonian producer's perspective (3)

- 3. Time to decide about Lithuanian new NPP will be in ~5 months:
  - Current development of regional market do not support the concept that investment into power plant in Lithuania is an investment into Estonian security of supply
  - Too many delays
  - Too general plans about level of harmonisation of important details

Conclusion: Better plan is needed and implemented
